



Top Questions People Ask About Bella

Q. What does Bella do?

A. Bella is a non-profit community service organization that offers free services to men and women in unplanned pregnancy situations. We offer free pregnancy testing with medically indicated ultrasound confirmation, reliable information on all options, confidential peer counseling, education and support through pregnancy, parenting classes, referrals for other community support and services such as: prenatal care, adoption services, financial aid, and housing. Bella also offers practical help like maternity and baby clothing, diapers, wipes and nursery furniture through the Earn While You Learn incentive program.

Q. Now that Bella offers medical services, does Bella take the place of an OB care physician?

A. Absolutely not. Bella does not offer prenatal care. Bella currently offers only two medical services; free pregnancy testing and ultrasound services (when medically indicated by a positive pregnancy test.)

Q. Can I go to Bella to find out the sex of my unborn baby?

A. Sorry. Determining the sex of an unborn child is outside the scope of Limited Obstetrical Ultrasound.

Q. What is "Limited Obstetrical Ultrasound"?

A. Limited Obstetrical Ultra-

sound is an ultrasound procedure that enables our medical staff to determine three things: confirm pregnancy, measure gestational age and determine viability of the developing fetus/embryo (i.e. is there a heartbeat, is the baby in the womb, and is our medical staff seeing what they would expect to see at the given stage of development?)

In regard to Bella clients:

Q. Are Bella's services limited to those with low-incomes or teenagers?

A. Crisis pregnancies can happen to anyone of childbearing age, including those who are married. Bella's services are open to anyone with a pregnancy related need, regardless of age, race, nationality, religion, marital status or financial status.

Q. Since Bella is a Christian organization, does Bella seek to convert people to a particular church?

A. Bella is an interdenominational Christian organization. As such, Bella staff and volunteers are free to share the gospel. However, we do not seek to convert clients to any one church. Like all referrals, Bella provides a list of churches in the area so the client can choose for herself/himself.

Q. Is Bella's goal to talk (or guilt) women out of having an abortion?

A. Bella believes very strongly in the sanctity of all human life, however, Bella is not here to sway women in their decisions. We provide reliable, accurate information on all options (including abortion procedures and risks) so a woman is able to make an informed decision regarding her pregnancy. It is our hope and prayer that through the information and services provided, women will make life-affirming choices but we do not use guilt, fear, or any other type of coercion in the interactions with our clients.

Q. Is Bella supported by government funds or grants?

A. The only government support that our organization has ever received were grants for the Stop and Think abstinence-until-marriage program. A large CBAE grant ended in October, 2008 and a smaller Title V grant ended in September, 2009. Because Bella wants to be free to share the Gospel and provide spiritual counsel to our clients, we do not seek government funding for our client services.

Q. Aside from money, what types of donations does Bella accept?

We accept donations of new or like new maternity or baby items (clothing, diapers, nursery furniture, etc.) We would also accept donations of office supplies.

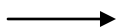
A Thought From the Executive Director, Roxie Johnson

This April will mark my 21st year as executive director of the pregnancy center. Over the years, I've witnessed many changes to the ministry, including two name changes, three moves and the additions of some very valuable programs and services.

I've had the privilege of working with some amazing people and I've learned some valuable life lessons, some that came through sweet victories and triumphs, and many that came through fiery trials and unexpected challenges.

I never thought that I'd be here this long. When I first started, I remember telling myself that I would try it for a year. At the time I felt so inadequate, I wasn't sure I'd last that long.

Since then, I've questioned the Lord on many occasions, "Why am I here?" "Someone else could do this job far better than I can, isn't there somewhere else you could use me?"

But then another client would come in—lost, hurting, and afraid. And once again I would know in my heart why I'm here. I'm here because of them.

One such client came in today. With other staff out sick, I had the privilege of assisting her. She didn't need a pregnancy test or an ultrasound, she just needed someone to talk to. So often, that's what our ministry is—a safe place

and a listening ear.

The client came in to discuss her fears and concerns about her pregnancy, but through the conversation the Lord opened doors to also talk about issues from past abuse, the Lord's plan and purpose for mankind, the value of abstinence, and the importance of prayer in the face of tough decisions.

What a joy to witness the transformation that quiet truth provides. This young woman came in with the weight of the world on her shoulders but left standing straight and tall, with a smile on her face and joy in her heart.

Bella isn't a ministry that is always out in front of the church and community, clashing big cymbals to draw attention to what we are doing. Instead, we work quietly in our corner of the world, speaking truth in love to each client God sends our way, affirming their great value and worth, and telling them of God's unconditional love.

For those who are always looking for the next big thing in pro-life work, Bella probably isn't glamorous or riveting enough for their involvement. But even though we're not big or flashy, no one can discount the enormous success we've had over the years of changing one heart and saving one life at a time.

When Elijah reached a point where

he felt he could not go on, he ran into the wilderness where God met him. But when the Lord "passed by" Elijah, He wasn't in the mighty wind that tore mountains and shattered rocks; nor was he in the earthquake that followed the wind; nor was He in the fire that following the earthquake. However, when Elijah heard a quiet, whispering voice, he went out to meet with the Lord and listen to what He had to say.

The voices of our staff and volunteers may not be loud enough to cause the world to stand up and notice, but they are powerful and effective for those who find Bella to be a refuge from life's storms.

I'm not a flashy person, but I am a practical person. I guess that's why Bella continues to be a good fit for me. Because even though it isn't a showy ministry, it is a practical ministry - offering help, support and life-affirming alternatives for those in crisis.

Bella isn't for everyone, but we are a ministry where believers can put feet to their faith by getting their spiritual hands dirty with those who need them most: those in the valley of decision.

If you think Bella might be a good fit for you, I'd love to talk to you about that possibility. Who knows, maybe next year we will both celebrate an anniversary.

Center Director/Nurse Notes *by Jodie Baxendale*

A trend that we have been noticing at a steady pace is young women, between the ages of 15-19, who are coming into Bella seeking pregnancy tests, with the high hopes that their results will read "positive".

These "planned teen pregnancies", are concerning. During the counseling process, the answers to some of the questions we ask are puzzling but insightful:

"Why do you want to be pregnant?" Their answers vary, but the primary answer we have received is that she thinks this is something that will be "fun". Some know of at least one other pregnant teen who is getting attention or going through the experience, and now they want to be a part of that group. A fad of sorts.

"Do you think you are well prepared and equipped to be a

parent now?" With full conviction, the answer usually is, "Yes, I am ready to have a baby now. It is what I want to experience right now in my life." They share a need to love someone and think it won't be hard to parent because they have babysat before, or helped family members with their babies in the past.

"Did you have future goals or plans before this possible pregnancy?" Most of the responses to this question is a simple "No." They don't offer any hints of possible college hopes, or career tracks, or plans for the future. The attitude is "whatever happens today, happens today, not sure about tomorrow".

"Do you have a religious preference?" or *"Do you have a relationship or belief in God?"*: The increasingly common answers to these questions

are, "None and no."

The above four questions and answers raise eyebrows and tear at the heart. What can we do? Where does the "void" stem from, and what keeps it fed? Bella's mission statement reads, *"The Bella Pregnancy Resource Center is a Christ centered ministry committed to upholding the sanctity of human life by empowering individuals to make informed choices."* Our attempts and efforts at Bella will not waiver. We will continue to speak the Truth in love. We will continue to educate on the value and importance of abstinence. We will continue to share with the clients that they are, or at least will be, someone's wife some day. And we will continue to express that God has a plan and a purpose for each one of us, encouraging the understanding of their self-worth and value.

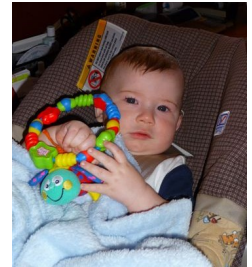

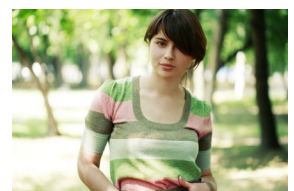

Q. How many other pregnancy centers are there in South Dakota? The USA?

A. There are three pregnancy resource centers in South Dakota (Care Net in Rapid City, Alpha Center in Sioux Falls and Bella in Spearfish). There are approximately 4,000 pregnancy help centers located in the United States. Bella belongs to two national organizations of pregnancy centers; Care Net and NIFLA. For more information on these organizations go to: www.care-net.org and www.nifla.org

Q. Is Bella a political organization?

A. Bella is not a political organization, but a very practical one. We are a crisis intervention center where women, men, and families can come for information, support, and education during an unplanned pregnancy. As a 501(C)3 organization, we do not lobby or endorse political parties or candidates.

Q. If Bella is a volunteer organization, why do you have paid staff?

A. Because Bella is a mission, we rely heavily upon volunteers in every aspect of ministry-from the Board of Directors to those who help with mailings. However, as a non-profit corporation, Bella also has a business aspect that must be managed with the highest level of integrity and consistency. Because of the high level of responsibility and accountability in managing the business aspects of Bella, paid staff have been retained to keep the organization

running smoothly.

Q. What kind of training do your volunteers and staff have to go through to work with clients?

A. Any staff or volunteers with direct contact with clients must complete a 24 hour volunteer training seminar and in-office training. The seminar teaches crisis intervention skills along with a wealth of information on abortion in America and the biblical basis for the sanctity of human life.

Q. Why don't more people know about Bella?

A. What we have found is that even when someone has heard our name, they usually don't think about Bella and what we have to offer until they (or someone they know) needs our services. However, we recognize that some people truly haven't heard about Bella before. Unfortunately, our limited budget makes it difficult to adequately promote our services through advertising and promotional venues. Bella also has a very small staff, each of whom must juggle many administrative and/or client service job duties. This adds to the difficulty of promoting the organization in the community. We would gladly welcome volunteer and financial help with marketing.

Q. Why did you change your name?

A. The name change was made in an effort to attract more post-modern generation clients. Short, catchy names that can be remembered a week later are very appealing to the age demographic that Bella primarily serves.

Q. Is Bella making a difference? Or...Is Bella really needed?

A. The number one response Bella has received from clients is; "I don't know what I would have done without you." Bella is walking in the footsteps of Jesus; bringing healing to the broken-hearted, defending the widow and fatherless (in today's society, single moms and their children fall into this category), providing for those in need, and teaching the truth in love. No other organization in our area offers free services to men and women in unplanned pregnancies. No other organization in our area offers a program like 'Earn While You Learn'. No other organization in our area offers an abstinence-until-marriage program to students in public school and youth organizations; no other organization in our area is offering free pregnancy testing and ultrasounds; no other organization in our area is providing free crisis intervention counseling for those in unplanned pregnancies. We are not aware of any other organization in the Northern Hills area that is upholding the Sanctity of Human Life by doing everything possible to enable abortion vulnerable women to carry their babies to term. One of the greatest joys of working or volunteering at Bella is holding a newborn baby in your arms that would have been aborted if not for this ministry. Each and every time the Lord gives us the privilege of doing this, it confirms what is already in our hearts, "we have to do everything we can to keep Bella going." Our hope and prayer is that you will help us do this.

Stop and Think—Information for Parents

What is "Sexting?" For those who don't know, "sexting" can be defined as any nude or semi-nude photos/videos or explicit texts sent electronically. This can include sending messages on cell phones as well as over the internet. For many teens, sexting is an impulse decision. Others are pressured into it by friends or boyfriends. Few ever consider the consequences. When a picture is sent out, there is no way to stop it from being sent to other cell phones or getting on the internet. Getting

caught often leads to embarrassment and depression. Many teens lose friends, which can deepen the depression.

Not long ago, I spoke with a young lady at one of my presentations who was living through the consequences of a decision she was pressured into. Up until then she was a model student and daughter, had plenty of friends, and never really got into trouble. Two years after sending a boyfriend a couple of nude photos, the photos resurfaced. She spent an entire day crying, and had to tell her mom the whole story. The bond of trust

was extremely damaged between the young lady and her mom, and as the story spread, almost all of her friends at school quit talking to her. Like most teens, she wasn't thinking that anything would come of a couple of photos from the past, but the depression, embarrassment, loneliness, and legal troubles (she was almost cited for producing child pornography) were very real consequences. The Stop and Think staff at the office are a great blessing to me. Thanks to everyone who makes my work in Central SD possible.

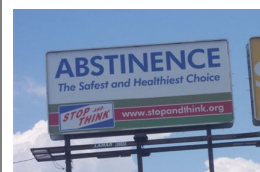

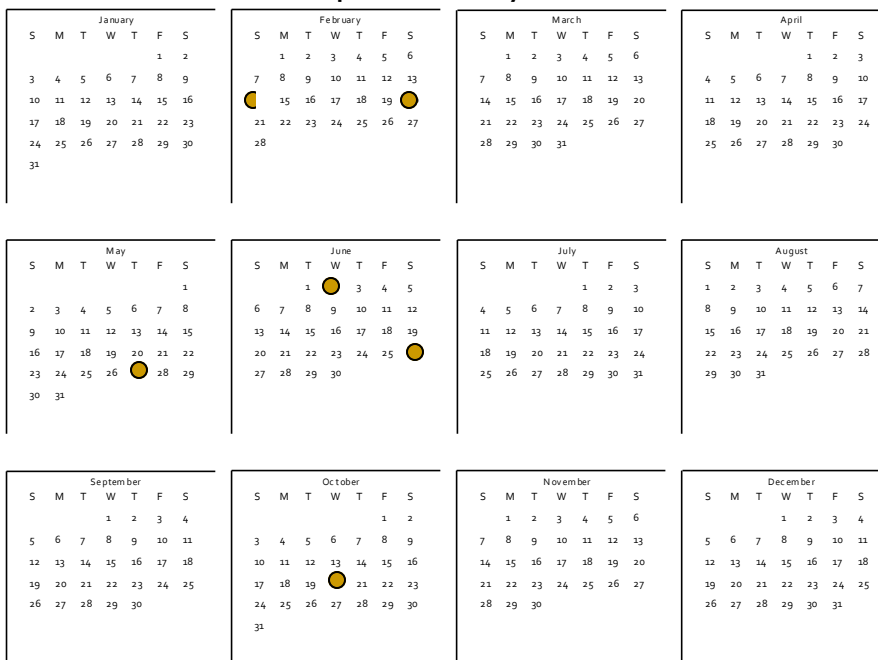
